The Shaunavon RCMP have received complaints of vehicle drivers not stopping for pedestrians who were crossing in designated crosswalks.

Shaunavon RCMP would like to remind drivers to be mindful of pedestrians and surroundings while driving. In the Saskatchewan Driver's Handbook states:

- ✓ When approaching an intersection, you must yield the right of way to any pedestrians who are crossing the street
- ✓ You must stop your vehicle before the crosswalk, which will either be painted on the road or be an imaginary extension of the sidewalk



To assist drivers in seeing pedestrians, the Town of Shaunavon has recently installed multiple flashing pedestrians crossing signs on Centre Street. You must come to a complete stop and allow the pedestrian to cross when the lights are flashing. Drivers are also asked to be extra aware around school transition times such as before school, lunch-times and after school for children coming and going around the schools. Drivers are reminded that all school zones and playground areas are always 25 km/h zones and the rest of the Shaunavon town-site is maximum of 40 km/h.
