Shaunavon RCMP provides tips on how residents can protect their property

Shaunavon RCMP would like to take this opportunity to remind residents to be mindful of your property.

Whether you live in a rural or urban community as a property owner, you also have a responsibility to reduce the instances of property crime. This includes adapting our strategies to keep your property safe:

- ✓ Lock all doors and windows. Ensure that all doors and windows of buildings (house, garage, quonsets, sheds, fuel tanks, etc.) are locked, even if you are at home.
- ✓ Lock your vehicles. Items such as keys, purse, wallets, cell phones, garage door openers should either be removed from the vehicle or locked in the vehicles storage cubicles. Also be mindful that even when running errands, an idling or unlocked vehicle is an easy target.
- ✓ Put away property away at night or when not in use.
- ✓ Keep records of items of value, documenting serial numbers, photographing and keep the bill of sale for these items. If there is no serial number then engrave or etch something on the item to make it unique.
- ✓ Install motion sensor lights. This illuminates the property which startles the person on your property. This will also make you aware that someone is on your property.


- ✓ Install security cameras. Technology today you can get security systems that can sync to a phone or computer for monitoring and recording.
- ✓ If you are going away for an extended period of time, ask someone that you trust to check on your residence, use a timer on lights to make it appear there is someone there, and don't post on social media that you are away.
- ✓ Report all criminal and suspicious activity immediately.
