## **Shaunavon RCMP remind drivers and pedestrians of Schools Zones**

As the new school year begins the Shaunavon RCMP would like to remind drivers about safety in the school zones. As drivers, it is our responsibility to be mindful of the rules of the road, especially when it comes to school zones.


Here are some tips to ensure that our scholars get safely to and from school:

- ✓ Certain times in school zones can become congested and difficult to identify possible hazards. Obey all signs, signals and watch for pedestrians who are crossing the street.
- ✓ Pay attention to the reduced speed limits that are posted in your school areas. Keep in mind that these school zones areas apply to the perimeter of the school areas.
- ✓ Slow down as you approach a school bus and come to a complete stop when the flashing red stop-arm or flashing red lights have been activated. This is an indicator that students are either boarding or exiting the bus.
- ✓ Pay attention to the “No Parking” and “No Stopping” zones near schools. Keeping these areas free of vehicles maintains proper visibility for motorists and pedestrians.
- ✓ Some schools have Crossing Guards programs for the safety of the students. These guards (adults or students) are easily recognizable as they are wearing a fluorescent orange vest.
- ✓ When dropping off your student, remember to park away from the congested area of the school zone. Have your scholars walk to the nearest cross walk and cross the street at that point.
